ITINERARY



FRIDAY, AUGUST 25

This morning we depart MSP Intl Airport for our flight to Munich, Germany.

SATURDAY, AUGUST 26

We arrive at Munich airport and transfer to Berchtesgaden where we check into our hotel. In the afternoon we take a tour through the old town's historical center, followed by free time. In the evening we enjoy a welcome drink and dinner at Hotel Grünberger. Overnight Berchtesgaden.

SUNDAY, AUGUST 27

After breakfast from the buffet, we take a pleasant boat trip on beautiful Königssee in the heart of the National Park. In the afternoon, we tour the famous Eagle's Nest, perched atop a 6,000 ft summit. Dinner and overnight Berchtesgaden.

MONDAY, AUGUST 28

After breakfast from the buffet, we make an excursion to Salzburg, famed as the birthplace of Mozart and the making of the Sound of Music. After a tour and free time, we'll return to Berchtesgaden, stopping at the Gentian Schnaps distillery. Those who wish, may take an exciting tour of the salt mines. Dinner and overnight Berchtesgaden.

TUESDAY, AUGUST 29

After breakfast from the buffet, we leave on an early departure for Nuremberg, making a stop at the German Car Museum in Amerang, followed by a short visit to the scenic town of Wasserburg where most might opt for a quick lunch snack. After checking into our hotel in Nuremberg, we'll be given a short orientation tour of the old town followed by dinner including the famous Nuremberg Bratwurst, perhaps accompanied by local beer. Overnight at Hotel Viktoria in Nuremberg

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 30

After breakfast from the buffet, we take a daytrip to the beautiful towns of Bamberg – known for its unique town hall on a bridge – and Würzburg, where we'll also visit the sumptuous Residence Palace. This evening we sample a Franconian wine before dinner. Overnight Nuremberg.

THURSDAY, AUGUST 31

After breakfast from the buffet, we visit the Nuremberg Trials courtroom and interpretation center, as well as the Party Rally Grounds and their documentation center. Late afternoon we'll be given a tour or demonstration of Nuremberg's famous gingerbread specialties the "Lebkuchen" at Wicklein's flagship store. Dinner and overnight Nuremberg.

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 1

After breakfast from the buffet, we travel to the romantic medieval town of Rothenburg ob der Tauber. After free time we continue on to the picture-perfect village of Gengenbach in the Black Forest. Dinner with tasting of regional wines. Overnight at Weinhotel Pfeffer und Salz, Gengenbach.

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 2

After breakfast from the buffet, we take a daytrip to two charming French towns: Riquewihr is a picture-perfect medieval village surrounded by vineyards while Colmar is best known for its charming architecture built along picturesque canals. Colmar was also the birthplace of Auguste Bartholdi who designed the Statue of Liberty. Some may wish to visit the small museum set up in the sculptor's birth house. Dinner and overnight Gengenbach.

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 3

After breakfast from the buffet, we take a daytrip to the fascinating Black Forest Open Air Museum as well as to Triberg, capital of the cuckoo-clock. Here we'll also be given a presentation of how the world-renowned Black Forest Cake is made, along with a slice of this delicious cake, served with coffee or tea. Overnight Gengenbach.

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 4

After breakfast from the buffet, we travel to Augsburg, stopping at two highlights in route. Our first stop will be at the medieval town of Esslingen with its numerous half-timbered houses. Here we'll also be given a tour and tasting of Germany's finest champagne method sparkling wine at Kessler Sekt. We'll then stop off for a visit to arguably the most stunning baroque library in Germany at Wiblingen Abbey. Dinner in Augsburg. Overnight Hotel Ost in Augsburg.

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 5

After breakfast from the buffet, we can enjoy free time in downtown Augsburg (for those who wish, David will also take us to the fascinating Fuggerei, the world's oldest social housing complex still in use today). We then spend the rest of the day at the Plärrer Volksfest, a traditional beer and funfocused festival that dates back to 1850. Dinner and overnight Augsburg

Triberg, Germany

Triberg lies in the middle of the Black Forest. In addition to spectacular waterfalls, it is also the capital of the "cuckoo-clock."

Wiblingen Abbey

Founded in 1093, the exquisite Rococo interior features an ornamental, winding gallery supported by multiple columns. The numerous statues and sweeping ceiling fresco represent the architect's vision that the library be a place for preserving "treasures of wisdom and science".



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Plärrer Volksfest

Traditional beer and funfocused festival dating back to 1850.
